## Auckland Arts Festival – Great Britten

The members of NZ Youth Choir and Voices NZ Chamber Choir, and Choirs Aotearoa's music and administration staff are still recovering from a busy week at the Auckland Arts Festival. Centred on the celebration of English composer Benjamin Britten's centenary there was a mid-week recital called (audaciously) 'Little Britten' which featured a *cappella* and organ accompanied Britten works performed by both choirs separately and jointly.

The grand finale of the Festival was a performance of Britten's monumental 'War Requiem' involving a large orchestra and chamber orchestra (Auckland Philharmonia), a large choir (NZ Youth Choir, Voices NZ Chamber Choir plus the Auckland Chamber Choir), a treble choir with choristers from Westlake Girls High School (Choralation – MD Rowan Johnston) and St Cuthbert's College (MD Megan Flint), three soloists and two conductors. A total of around 240 musicians packed onto the stage with a few on side balconies of Auckland Town Hall.

Hymn to the Virgin: The New Zealand Youth Choir's young singers delivered warm and sonorous praise; conductor David Squire balanced them expertly against Voices New Zealand Chamber Choir, positioned high in a balcony, behind the audience....

Voices New Zealand Chamber Choir included Britten's Flower Songs in its town hall concert last year. Tonight, even more enjoyment was to be had as they reprised the work. Grylls swept them through the lilting Daffodils and ensured Ballad of Green Broom had the right earthy thrust.

These 16 singers also excelled in the composer's challenging Sacred and Profane, eight medieval lyrics set by Britten towards the end of his life....

The concert ended in full celebratory mode with a 1961 Jubilate Deo. When the singers gave out its fervent, generously phrased tune, one could almost imagine Britten, had he lived a generation or two earlier, may well have penned a Jerusalem or I Vow to Thee, My Country.

Little surprise then that the 90 engrossing minutes of Auckland Philharmonia Orchestra's War Requiem resulted in a packed town hall. This was a magnificent undertaking - not only because of the indisputable quality of Britten's score, but for the way in which it brought together the city's young musicians with the APO in one of the monumental works of the last century. Watching Eckehard Stier on the podium, one

could sense Britten's music emanating from his baton ....


The combined singers of Voices New Zealand Chamber Choir and the New Zealand Youth Choir, together with the local Auckland Chamber Choir, were splendid.


So too was the young treble choir, conducted by Karen Grylls, expertly navigating Britten's tricky lines over John Wells' pellucid organ sonorities.
