# **Youth Choir Ahoy**

It has become a tradition at NZ Youth Choir residencies to engage with the local community during the week one way or another. In Hastings last April the choir gave a 'flash mob' open-air concert in the centre of town and held masterclass sessions for Hawke's Bay young choristers and aspiring conductors. This was not so easy to arrange earlier this month with the course being in the fairly isolated Living Springs Camp at Governor's Bay. This time it had to be an organised concert in the nearby town of Lyttelton. But, as we discovered, Lyttelton had been very knocked about by the February 2011 earthquake and every church and large hall had been rendered unusable. The only assembly hall of any size was the Naval Point Club (the yacht club) and on Thursday afternoon, 6 September. Lyttelton and Christchurch choral enthusiasts were treated to a concert of a cappella music. It was a full house - at least 100 adults and children, and the 42 members of NZYC performed against a wall decorated with seafaring pictures and ships' pennants and hemmed in by a closed and shuttered bar. It wasn't Carnegie Hall but everyone really enjoyed the concert.

NZ Youth Choir and NZSO National Youth Orchestra combined project

The opportunity to sing with an orchestra is very rare indeed. Rarer still is the opportunity to sing with a very talented orchestra. The initial excitement I felt about New Zealand Youth Choir's collaboration with the NZSO National Youth Orchestra was amplified when we arrived at Living Springs camp, in Governor's Bay, near Lyttelton. From our rehearsal space (the communal dining room!) we could hear snippets of the orchestra from down the hall, but it was not until our first combined rehearsal that we were hit by the power and skill of the orchestra.

Conductor extraordinaire Wyn Davies had a masterful control of the NYO, at times pulling huge impressive swells out of the strings, at other times shaping perfectly delicate woodwind lines. It was a huge privilege to be conducted by Wyn, an extraordinary breed of orchestra conductor that is also able to control singers extremely well.


Outside of 'business hours', it was great to meet up with old and new friends from all over New Zealand, and in general there was a

great atmosphere around the camp, highlighted by the often-cringe worthy talent show and the celebratory impromptu dance party on the last night.

It was a tremendous pleasure to sing Tippett's 'A Child if Our Time' as part of the NZYC/NYO collaboration, and I will value this experience as a highlight of my musical life.

As a choir, we cannot thank everyone involved enough, and we can't wait for the next collaboration between these two great national organisations.
