Who We Are

Choirs Aotearoa New Zealand (CANZ) is the home of three national choirs and a national choral academy:

- New Zealand Youth Choir (NZYC) A premier national choir for singers aged 18–25.
- Voices New Zealand A professional chamber choir.
- New Zealand Secondary Students' Choir (NZSSC) A national choir for high school students.
- Aotearoa Academy Choir (AAC) A national choral academy for singers aged 13-25.

The New Zealand Youth Choir

- Established in **1979** as the first national youth choir in the world, NZYC has achieved international acclaim, winning awards at major competitions and festivals worldwide.
- Committed to presenting **diverse and innovative choral repertoire**, including works from Aotearoa and the Pacific.
- A training ground for emerging choral talent, providing high-level artistic and professional development.

3. Why we audition

The recruitment for this important role follows our new 'Music Director Appointment Policy' that has these objectives:

- 1. Promote professional pathways for choral conductors in Aotearoa New Zealand
- 2. Create viable succession planning for top choral conductors
- 3. Create new viewpoints and a sense of rejuvenation of the artistic leadership of our choirs and the organization
- 4. Create a competitive environment for its singers and artistic staff members to achieve the level of excellence associated with our national choirs.

To deliver to this policy all CANZ Music Director roles will become publicly contested once an MD has served two choir cycles with their choirs and then again after each subsequent cycle. This process of opening an MD role for public auditions is not a reflection on the status of the incumbent in any form, in fact the incumbents are encouraged to apply for another cycle if they so desire.

4. The Role: Music Director, New Zealand Youth Choir

- Reports to: Chief Executive, Choirs Aotearoa New Zealand
- Location: New Zealand (some travel required for rehearsals and tours)
- Contract: Fixed Term Project based 2026 2028
- Remuneration: Daily rates for project work plus retainer, commensurate with experience

Key Responsibilities

Artistic Leadership

- Develop and implement an inspiring artistic vision for NZYC.
- Select repertoire that showcases musical excellence and reflects the cultural identity of Aotearoa.
- Collaborate with composers, musicians, and artistic partners.
- Contributing member of CANZ Artistic Advisory Group.

Rehearsal & Performance Direction

- Lead high-quality rehearsals and performances.
- Provide vocal training and musicianship development for choir members.
- Conduct national and international tours, recordings, and special projects.

Singer Development & Engagement

- Mentor and develop young singers, fostering individual and collective growth.
- Provide artistic leadership that supports diversity and inclusion.
- Work with vocal coaches and music educators to ensure a high standard of training.

Collaboration & Partnerships

- Work with Choirs Aotearoa New Zealand leadership to plan programming and tours.
- Engage with the wider choral, classical music, and arts communities in New Zealand and internationally.

5. Person Specification

Essential Criteria:

- Proven experience in choral conducting at a high national level.
- Deep knowledge of choral repertoire, vocal technique, and ensemble training.
- A strong commitment to fostering young musical talent.
- Understanding of Te Ao Māori and Pasifika musical traditions, or a willingness to engage in these areas.
- Experience in planning and delivering performances at an international standard.

Desirable Criteria:

- Experience leading a youth or professional ensemble.
- Familiarity with the New Zealand and international choral scenes.
- A track record of commissioning and performing new choral works.

26-30 May Interviews for shortlisted candidates (via Zoom)

14 June Practical assessment with top 2-3 candidates (Auckland)

19 June Announcement of appointment

Shortlisted candidates will be invited to **interview via Zoom**, and final candidates will conduct a **practical audition with a special audition choir in Auckland**. There will be up to 4 people on the interview committee, a mix of CANZ and external experts.

8. How to Apply

Interested candidates should submit the following materials:

1. Core Application Materials

- **Cover letter** outlining your interest in the role and relevant experience.
- Curriculum Vitae (CV) detailing your conducting and teaching experience.

2. Video Submissions

- A video of you rehearsing a choir, demonstrating your rehearsal techniques and engagement.
- A video of you conducting a choir in performance, showcasing your artistic and interpretive skills.

3. Repertoire & Artistic Vision

• Your ideal repertoire list for a three-year cycle, including a written explanation of why you chose these pieces.

4. Written Reflection

Provide a written response (max 1,500 words) addressing the following questions:

- 1. **Do you think there should be a national youth choir for this age group?** What should it be doing/achieving?
- 2. What is unique about NZYC in a global context?
- 3. How does technology influence your perspective on choral singing at this level?
